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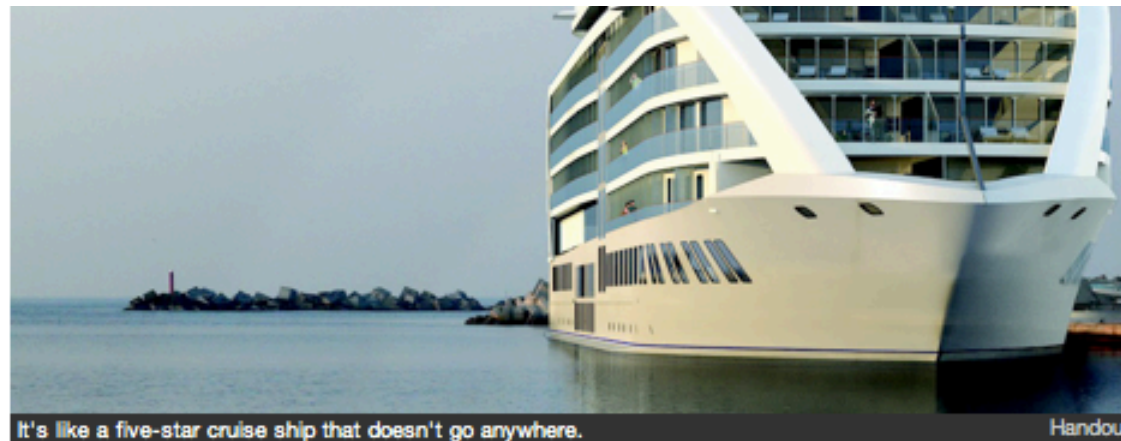
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This Gibraltar superyacht hotel is designed to float the boat of your inner tycoon

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Ever wonder what it's like to spend a night on a Russian tycoon's super yacht? Once you got past the inappropriate levels of drinking, bare-chested homophobia and dark whiffs of czarism, it's probably lovely. It might, in fact, be something very much like what Finnish company Sunborn will be offering later this year with Sunborn Gibraltar, a \$200-million, 189-room yacht to be permanently anchored at a pier in the harbour in Gibraltar. It comes with a casino, a ballroom, even a conference centre. The only thing it doesn't offer is cruises. Though technically mobile, the plan is to keep it where it is. It's to be the first of many five-star yacht hotels, with Barcelona and London in the offing. Rooms go from \$320 to \$3,200. At 142 metres, it's 38 metres shy of the world's largest, but we're guessing without any oligarchical egos on board, it'll feel more spacious (sunborngibraltar.com).
